I was born in Des Moines, attended Van Meter School and graduated from there. I grew up in an Evangelical Free and Catholic household where I accepted Christ at an early age. I played college baseball at Iowa Central in Fort Dodge and then went on to finish my

degree at the University of Grand Canyon in Phoenix, AZ. I married my college sweetheart after college and lived a blessed marriage

early on. Then there were some marital issues that we had to work through to reconcile. We then had a daughter. I found out 6 months later she wasn't mine due to my wife having an affair. After the heartache I wrongly chose bitterness, resentment, and walked away from God. Through many relationships I found myself in the deepest and darkest moment of my life, battling depression (suicidal), anxiety, and alcoholism. On 10/22 I was arrested for theft in an unfortunate family affair. Three days into

- We need daily prayer for spiritual oppositions that come against the ministry.
- Local churches would partner with us in receiving men and women released from the PC Jail, offer mentors, and support for their spiritual growth. This is a key component to sustain what God has begun in each life.
- God would create a crowd for the DOC's greater impact. The seeds we've sown will create fruit in those desiring to be discipled. New curriculum is coming for the start up this Fall.

After 13 weeks in jail I got probation, only to slip back into it, but God had a plan. I was sentenced to prison on 05/24 for a probation violation. Christ convicted me to full repentance where I put my hand to the plow and have not looked back! I would have never known God's mercy, grace, and love had I not gone to prison. Within a few months Christ has freed me from prescription medicine for depression and anxiety. It's a true

miracle! I hope to work again with special needs children/adults, and get into prison ministry as soon as possible. I give special thanks to

my mother, Gary's, and Church prayers. God is faithful, and through Him nothing is impossible.
